Our school is always buzzing with amazing learning opportunities provided by our hard working teachers. Already I have been impressed by the way the kids have settled back into class and by the way they are taking these opportunities and embracing them. In our senior school this week we have had a virtual reality experience, exploring the underwater world around our coastline. It was quite a sight to see all the classes with their goggles on exploring the ocean.

A group of our year 6 children, known as our 'Enterprise Group' are working on another Mother's Day Market. This is a gift market for the children to buy their presents for Mother's Day. The children can bring money (we recommend no more than \$20, gifts will range from \$4 up to \$10 approximately) in an envelope to school and each class will be given a time slot to go down with their class to look at the market and buy a gift or two on Tuesday and Wednesday next week..The gifts are sourced from a commercial company and include travel mugs, water bottles, candles and many other lovely gifts. The gifts are bagged up for the children, any change put in a small snaplock bag or envelope and the kids are all set for Mother's Day! Please support this initiative, the group have put a lot of work into market. This was very popular last year and we had to put in an emergency order to cover demand! All the profits go to the school, and the enterprise group will be looking into areas that will benefit our school to spend their profits on. The market will be open after school on Tuesday and Wednesday as well, until 3.30pm.

Next Friday (10th) we also have the disco. The Year 1-3 disco runs from 5pm-6pm and the year 4-6 disco will be from 6.30pm to 8pm. While the disco is on we host an information event in the year 2 block, complete with a glass of wine! This time we are sharing our new school charter, that we took your input on at the disco last year. This is the school guiding document that looks at the priorities in your child's education for the next three years. We will also have our Community of Learning lead principal, Maree Bathurst, there as well, to answer any questions or just have a chat about what the Community of Learning is and why it is important to the children at our school. The Community of Learning is a group of schools working together to innovate within teaching and learning, share expertise and look at how we can provide clear and easy transitions as children move schools to Albany Junior High and beyond. We'd love you to join us to see the direction the school is moving in, have a glass of wine and enjoy a chance to meet and mingle with other parents at our school, while your children enjoy their disco!

Finally, on Friday 10th of May our teachers will be attending the N.Z.E.I. meeting. N.Z.E.I. is the union that represents primary teachers, primary principals and support staff. Under the Employment Relations Act, paid union meetings are a legal entitlement. These negotiations are critical as there is currently a significant teacher shortage in New Zealand (and particularly Auckland). This is resulting in many less candidates for teaching vacancies. This shortage has occurred due to a number of factors; including a decline in teacher training and increased workload, which the teachers are trying to address in the current round of negotiations with the Government through their union representatives.

We are conscious of school events we have planned for that week, such as a rippa tournament, the Mother's Day market, junior school trips, disco, as well as the classroom programmes. Attending the meeting on the afternoon of the 10th May allows our school based events to continue, which is important to our teachers, while also understanding the importance of attendance at the meeting to ensure our children get the education they deserve.

As most of our teachers will be attending this meeting, the school will only have limited supervision for children on **Friday 10th May from 12.30 onwards**, and we are encouraging parents to collect their children at 12.30 if possible. A letter regarding this went home on Tuesday. **Please return the slip by tomorrow**, so we can ensure the safe supervision of the children who aren't being collected at 12.30pm. *Please note that there will be no lunch orders on that day.*

We thoroughly appreciate your support in this.
